COMMUNITY MENTAL HEALTH

Program Description

The Community Mental Health Certificate Program is designed to prepare students with the necessary knowledge and skills to pursue a position in the mental health field or provide an opportunity for advancement through credentialing for those already working in the field. Areas of study include trauma, vocational rehabilitation, substance abuse, listening/communication techniques, and cultural awareness. Upon completion of the certificate requirements students are eligible to apply for the Mental Health Rehabilitation Technician Community (MHRT/C) certificate through the State of Maine. This certificate represents the minimum licensing qualifications necessary for working in the mental health field in Maine and is required for all positions funded by the Maine Department of Health and Human Services. The courses in this program are transferable to the Behavioral Health Studies program.

Program Learning Outcomes

Students who successfully complete the Community Mental Health Certificate will be able to:

- Demonstrate cultural awareness and sensitivity to working with diverse populations.
- Utilize listening and communication techniques which demonstrate an empathic and non-judgmental approach to helping clients.
- Articulate awareness of the importance of self-care and what that means for them as an individual.
- Collaborate with clients to optimize access to services.
- Recognize the importance of adhering to ethical guidelines relating to issues such as confidentiality and providing services in the least restrictive setting.

Career Opportunities

Qualified graduates of the Community Mental Health certificate will be eligible for entry level employment at community health centers, hospitals, schools, social service and mental health programs, and child care settings. Specific jobs may include, but are not limited to, Community Support Worker, Residential Service Worker, Rehabilitation Technician, Youth and Family Counselor, Case Manager, Direct Support Professional, Life Skills Coach, and in-home Support Worker.

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Articulation agreements exist between York County Community College and various colleges and universities. Please work with your advisor for information regarding these agreements.
